Carbon Monoxide Detector

Do you have a carbon monoxide detector? If so, have you checked to make sure it is working? Have you changed the battery? Carbon monoxide can come from a number of sources in the home:

- · Furnace systems and chimneys with leaks
- · Wood burning stoves and fireplaces
- Gas ranges
- Generators
- Kerosene heaters
- · Fireplaces that aren't vented
- · Cigarette and pipe smoke

When carbon monoxide gas contaminates the air, you breathe in more carbon monoxide than oxygen. Once it enters the body, it gets into

the blood, where it takes place of oxygen.

The first symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning include:

- · Chest tightness or shortness of breath
- Tiredness
- Nausea
- Confusion
- Headaches
- Dizziness

Inhaling high quantities can quickly lead to unconsciousness and suffocation.

A carbon monoxide detector is a must for any home and just as important as a smoke detector. CO detectors should be placed near all bedrooms. They're the only way you'll know if carbon monoxide is affecting the air quality in your home. If you experience any carbon monoxide poisoning symptoms, even if the detector alarm hasn't sounded, get everyone out of your home into fresh air immediately!

Toilets and Drains

There are certain items that we should never put down the toilets and/or drains to avoid backing up the pipes. See the list below:

- Wipes- even "flushable" wipes don't decompose fast enough and could cause clogs
- Feminine Hygiene Productspads, sanitary napkins, tampons should be disposed of in the trash (baby products, such as diapers, should be disposed of in the trash)
- Paper Products- paper towels, facial tissue, and cotton balls
- Medications: Flushing medications can contaminate water sources. Dispose of them at designated collection sites or through proper disposal programs.
- Other items- Anything made of plastic



Honey Do List

Bears and bees have plenty to celebrate this September during National Honey Month. Comb through these alternatives to the ever-popular clover honey to find a new favorite.

Tupelo. Nicknamed the "champagne of honey," this rare treat can only be harvested after the tupelo trees bloom in the swamps of the Southeast U.S., which only lasts two to three weeks.

Manuka. Often described as creamy and nutty in taste, this popular product hails from New Zealand.

Orange Blossom. Honey lovers are in for citrus scents with this unique version, grown today mostly in Florida, Texas and California.

Wildflower. The busy bees who make this honey gather nectar from a range of local wildflowers, resulting in a rainbow of hues and flavors.

Purple honey. This honey has both beekeepers and scientists alike stumped on what causes the unusual hue. Because of its rarity, purple honey is typically only available from specific sources, which post it for sale as the bees work their mysterious magic.

Egg Tot Muffins

Ingredients:

- Butter
- · 36 thawed tater tots
- 10 eggs
- 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream or half-and-half
- · 1/2 cup shredded cheese
- · 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- · 2 teaspoons onion powder
- 1 package (2 1/2 ounces) real bacon pieces
- · salt, to taste
- · pepper, to taste

Directions:

Heat oven to 350 F.

Grease muffin tin with butter. Place three tots in each muffin hole and smash down.

In bowl, whisk eggs, cream, cheese, garlic powder, onion powder and bacon pieces. Season with salt and pepper, to taste. Fill each muffin hole completely with mixture.

Place cookie sheet under muffin tin to contain messes and bake 20-25 minutes.
