Reminder: Parking & Car Plates

This is a reminder that vehicles cannot be parked at the pool or flag park for more than 24 hours, or tow tags will be placed on the vehicle. Vehicles also cannot be parked on the street overnight, or your vehicle will be towed without warning. Be sure to let your guests know. Signs are posted at both entrances. Cars must also have updated plates and be operative.

Keep a Fire Extinguisher Nearby

Keep fire extinguishers close to potential fire hazards in your home and office so you can respond quickly in an emergency. For fast and easy access, it's recommended to keep one in or near every room and one in the garage labeled for flammable liquids.

Clean and Green Inspections

Every month we inspect each and every home in the park to ensure its cleanliness is being maintained. We must take two pictures of the exterior of every home and submit it. There are multiple people with different vehicles who perform this task. Please make sure the exterior of your home (including landscaping) is being

Extra Trash Pickup Day

Extra trash pickup day will be Wednesday, April 16th. Only 3 large items per household. NO garbage bags or yard waste! Here are some approved items: couches, tables, dressers, mattresses, toilets, dryers, stoves, dishwashers, TV stands, chairs, etc. Please contact the office if you have questions about other items.



Check Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Detectors

It's recommended to test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors at least once a month to ensure they are functioning properly. To test a smoke detector or carbon monoxide detector, simply press and hold the "test" button located on the device until you hear a loud alarm sound; most carbon monoxide detectors will emit a series of beeps to indicate a successful test, while smoke detectors usually have a continuous alarm sound.

Spring Clean Up 2025

- Power washing of Home/ Skirting/Shutters
- All Garbage cans must be stored in shed/garage. No Exceptions.
- All items currently being stored outside the shed/garage must be stored inside the shed/garage. Absolutely no storage or tarps allowed outside the home.
- Lawn Mowers and Yard Equipment must be in the shed/garage when not in use.
- Lawns are to be treated for weeds and dandelions.
- Garden hoses must be kept in proper gardening holders or Hose Hideaways.
- Yards must be maintained including treating grass with a weed and feed, bushes, shrubbery, and trees must be trimmed. If tree is hanging over home or neighbor's home it must be trimmed. Leaves need to be raked, picked up and put in brown yard waste bags to be brought down to the dumpster area.
- All driveways must be cleared of any stains and or oil leaking from vehicles.
- Flower beds need to be neat in appearance. No empty flower pots.
- Patio furniture needs to be clean and in good condition. No camping chairs.
- Toys and bikes must be organized and put out of site when not in use not left out overnight.
- No baby pools. No Exceptions.
- Patio needs to be cleaned off, grills patio furniture and fire pits are allowed. All fire
 pits must be on cement.
- All pets waste must be cleaned up on a daily basis.
- No dog leashes tied to stair railings.
- Skirting/Siding should be intact and secured, holes in skirting or siding needs to be replaced.
- Windows and Screens should be replaced if there are cracks or holes. <u>No blankets</u>, <u>sheets</u>, <u>or plastic in windows</u>. All blinds need to be hanging straight. Broken blinds must be replaced.
- All sunrooms must be cleared of clutter and cannot be used as additional storage unless blinds are installed and area cannot be seen from street.
- All homes must have clear address numbers (visible from the road.)
- All vehicles must be licensed and have current sticker. Please keep vehicle in good condition.
- All flags must be kept in good condition.



Ballpark Highlights

They have been called shrines, cathedrals, temples and monuments. Some Major League Baseball stadiums are as iconic as the sport itself, and each one has its unique features. Here are some that make game days even more memorable.

Wrigley Field. The Chicago Cubs' century-old home is full of nostalgic features, and one of the most famous is the ivy that covers the brick walls of the outfield. It was planted in 1937 and grows so thick, baseballs get lost in it.

Fenway Park. Standing 37 feet high and stretching across the left field of the nation's oldest active MLB stadium is the fabled Green Monster, a fence that got its name when it was painted in 1947. Boston Red Sox fans can now watch the game from seats atop it.

Oracle Park. The Giants' ballpark sports views of the San Francisco Bay. The water is so close that fans can boat and kayak in a cove just off right field in hopes of catching home runs, or "splash hits."

Chase Field. The Arizona
Diamondbacks make their home in the
desert city of Phoenix, so it's fitting
their stadium has a seating section
with a swimming pool!

T-Mobile Park. Because of the city's rainy weather, Seattle Mariners fans are used to umbrellas, and its ballfield is outfitted with one, too. Since debuting in 1999, the retractable roof has scored big for its open-air design.





White Pizza Frittata

Ingredients:

- · 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- · 1 large clove garlic, minced
- 12 ounces frozen spinach, thawed and water pressed out
- · 12 large eggs
- 1/4 cup skim milk
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano leaves
- · 3/4 cup part-skim ricotta cheese
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup minced fresh basil
- 1/2 cup shredded, part-skim mozzarella cheese

Directions:

Heat oven to 325° F.

In oven-safe skillet, heat olive oil over medium heat. Add garlic and cook 2 minutes or until fragrant. Add spinach and stir.

In medium bowl, whisk together eggs, milk, pepper, oregano, ricotta, Parmesan and basil.

Add egg mixture to skillet, reduce heat to low and cook 1 minute, stirring gently. Move to oven and bake 25 to 30 minutes, or until eggs are almost completely set.

Carefully remove from oven and add mozzarella. Return to oven and bake until mozzarella is melted, about 5 minutes.
