The Coffee Brewing Craze

Coffee has been around since the 9th century, so it's only natural that people have come up with more and more ways to brew the perfect cup. Which of these methods perks your interest the most?

Boiling. The simplest method of brewing, boiling coffee produces a strong, no-fuss flavor. Commonly called cowboy coffee, it's made by mingling water and coffee grounds in a pot, which is placed over a fire—great for camping trips!

Steeping. This method also puts coffee grounds and hot water in direct

contact, but the grounds are filtered out before drinking. A French press device serves out a strong, distinctly flavored cuppa. Steeping with cold water produces cold brew coffee, which has a sweet, non-acidic taste and is ideal for iced coffee beverages.

Drip. Standard coffee pots, also called auto-drip machines, use this method. Pour-overs are another drip technique that's gained popularity in recent years as a quick way to make a small serving of clear-tasting coffee. Just place a cone over a mug or carafe and insert a paper filter, fill the filter with grounds, then pour hot water over them.

Pressure. This technique ensures a highly concentrated and caffeinated shot of java. Espresso is the most popular, but single-serve pod machines have also become mainstream in many homes and businesses.



Cleaning Up After Our Dogs!

Puppy Dog Eyes

National Puppy Day, March 23, celebrates the irresistible charm of puppies. Scientists have recently discovered that the mournful expression affectionately called

"puppy dog eyes" is a trait that domesticated dogs developed over generations in order to communicate with people. Unlike their close relative the wolf, dogs have facial muscles that enable them to raise their eyebrows, which triggers a nurturing emotion in humans.

Reminder: No Overnight Parking

The Name Game

Have you ever found your name on a plastic keychain? Just like music, movies and cars, names go through trends. While some names stay current for long periods of time, others can be pinpointed to certain decades.

Names can trend for many reasons. One large influence is pop culture. Naming a child after an actor, musician, song title or fictional character is a common occurrence. Another influence is politics. Teddy gained popularity in honor of Theodore Roosevelt, as did Reagan for Ronald Reagan. More recently, the popularity of the musical about Founding Father Alexander Hamilton has transformed his surname into a first-name fad.

Trends also can come from the sound and rhythm of words, called prosody. Examples include Ethan and Aiden, ending with an "N" sound, or Carl and Kayla, beginning with a hard "K" sound. Experts say this type of pattern often emerges from parents subconsciously picking up a preference for certain sounds.

In the 1940s, the most popular names were James, Robert, Mary and Linda. The 1970s saw the top two male names of Michael and Christopher, which stayed in their positions for three decades, until Jacob rose in the ranks in the 2000s. Female names cycled much more quickly through the years, with top picks ranging from Lisa, Jennifer and Amy to Jessica, Emily and Madison.

The 21st century has seen a surge in more creative monikers as well as a return to classic names.

What's Cooking

Fish With Bok Choy and Rice

Light and flavorful, this meal comes together in minutes.

Ingredients:

- 1 fillet of white fish, such as tilapia, cod or halibut
- · Salt and pepper
- · 1 tablespoon butter
- · 1 teaspoon sesame oil
- · 1 teaspoon grated ginger
- · 2 baby bok choy, quartered
- 1 teaspoon soy sauce
- 1 cup cooked brown rice

Directions:

Use a paper towel to pat dry each side of the fish fillet. Season both sides with salt and pepper.

In a medium skillet, melt butter over medium-high heat. Add fish and cook for 2 minutes on each side. Remove fish from pan and keep warm.

In the same pan, add sesame oil and ginger. Cook for 1 minute.

Add bok choy to pan and stir-fry for 2 minutes. Add soy sauce and stir to incorporate.

Immediately serve fish over the cooked bok choy and warmed rice.

"This Month In History" MARCH

1912: The first parachute jump from a moving airplane takes place. U.S. Army Capt. Albert Berry made the leap over St. Louis, Mo.

1936: The Hoover Dam is complete! After five years of construction, the dam spanning the Colorado River between Arizona and Nevada was able to begin creating hydroelectric power.

1941: Nashville, Tenn., becomes the home of the first FM radio station. WSM-FM was a commercial station for the National Life and Accident Insurance Company.

1958: Elvis Presley enters the U.S. Army. Already a rock 'n' roll star, he remained an active duty soldier for two years.

1964: The first Ford Mustang rolls off the production assembly line.

1977: Scientists discover that Uranus has rings, like its fellow planet Saturn. Dark in color, the rings were only seen because a star blinked repeatedly as the planet's rings passed in front of it.

1981: President Ronald Reagan is shot and wounded in an assassination attempt. At the hospital, Reagan reportedly joked to his wife, "Honey, I forgot to duck."

1998: "Titanic" becomes the highest-grossing movie in box office history, earning over \$2.2 billion worldwide. It was later surpassed by "Avatar" (2009) and "Avengers: Endgame" (2019).

2005: The PlayStation Portable handheld gaming console debuts in North America. In five years, 17 million PSPs were sold in the U.S. alone.
